Butt Detective series so popular among the picture-book set now has a companion in this illustrated chapter-book series targeted at elementary-age children. This is the first volume in the series and contains two all-new stories.

In the title work, Butt Detective is in his office reading the newspaper during tea time, and an article about a serial burglar wanted by the police has just caught his eye when a woman dressed from head to toe in purple comes in the door. She needs him to decode a message she recently discovered at the back of her safe, she says. It was apparently placed there by her ancestors on the farm that has long been in the family, and she is convinced it will lead her to treasure if she can break the code. The detective thinks she must be the woman people call "Lady Purple" mentioned in another article in that day's paper—the owner of a sweet potato farm who loves to dress in purple. Although he senses something suspicious about her, he works with her to solve a number of different puzzles, and in the end succeeds in learning the location of the treasure as well as his client's true identity: though disguised as Lady Purple, this is actually the male burglar the detective had read about in the paper.



Troll: Troll is a team consisting of writer Yoko Tanaka (1976–) and illustrator Masahide Fukasawa (1981–). Together they produce picture books, illustrations, and application graphics for the iPhone, iPad, and Android. Their first picture book, Butt Detective, has expanded into a multi-volume series.



Zorori's PV with English subtitles (3 minutes 40 seconds)





Yutaka Hara: Yutaka Hara (1953–), born in Kumamoto Prefecture, made his debut as an illustrator at the age of 20. In 1974 he won the Children's Literature Prize in the Kodansha Famous Schools Contest. The character Zorori originally appeared as the villain in the Horenso-man (Spinach Man) series, written by Shiho Mizushima and drawn by Hara from March 1985 to June 1987, before becoming the main character in his own series from 1987 onward. In 2008, an exhibition titled "Fun with the Incredible Zorori: Yutaka Hara and the Zorori Crew" opened at the Kamakura Museum of Literature and later toured museums in Sendai and Himeji.

You Look, Yummy!

Long, long ago, as a volcano erupts with a great roar and the ground below quakes, a baby ankylosaur hatches from his egg. As the little ankylosaur begins wandering about all by himself, a big, bruising tyrannosaur comes along. "Oh, yummy! Eh heh heh heh," he exclaims in delight, and is about to pounce when the baby ankylosaur cries out, "Daddy!" and grabs onto his leg. In surprise, the tyrannosaur realizes that the little one has misunderstood and thinks he was being called "Yummy" as a name. And so it is that a tyrannosaur takes on the task of raising a baby ankylosaur. Yummy looks up to the tyrannosaur in everything he does, and says repeatedly, "I want to be just like you, Daddy!" Although the tyrannosaur feels a little guilty for hiding his real self and perpetuating a lie, the two develop ever stronger bonds of love. But then comes the day when they must part . . .

The tale highlights the importance of family and of the love between parent and child by showing that bonds can grow just as strong even in a case of mistaken identity as they do between actual relations—possibly even stronger. The book is the first in a tremendously popular series featuring a tyrannosaur in 15 titles to date, with combined sales in excess of 19.5 million. In 2010 and 2015, the series became an animated film.



Yoshio Nakae and Noriko Ueno: Yoshio Nakae and Noriko Ueno began producing picture books together while still in school. Among their most best-known works are *The Little Mouse's Vest* (Kodansha Award for Picture Books) and the series of sequels that followed; and *Mischievous Rara* (Japan Picture Book Award). In 2005, Nakae and Ueno received the Iwaya Sazanami Literary Award for the body of work they had produced together.

The authors describe the friends, such as Cat, Duck, Rabbit, Pig, Lion and Elephant, making the most of each animal's characteristics, and write humorous and charming stories. "Little Mouse" series won four awards, including the Kodansha Award for Picture Books, and has sold more than 10 million copies.

The Magic Garden and Mysterious Herb Recipes

With a violinist father and pianist mother, Jarett long lived out of a suitcase, traveling from city to city around the world wherever her parents performed. Always staying in hotels, the family never had a place to call home. Jarett's friends thought she was lucky, because she always had people waiting on her and taking care of things for her; but she longed for her own home, where she would have to do her own cleaning and could have a pet to take care of.

Then the herb witch Topaz, a distant relative, leaves her a small cottage in her will. Against her parents' initial opposition, Jarett takes up residence there, together with six kittens. Following the recipes in a book left by Topaz, she mixes herbs from the garden, and when she gives these mixtures to her neighbors as medicines, they are very helpful A continuing theme of the series to which this story belongs is the many different efficacies of herbs and aroma essences. The series has been highly popular in Japan, with 24 volumes published so far.

In 2012 she won the Joji Tsubota Award for *Kimi wa Ii Ko*, which was also made into a movie. Besides the works that she has created, she also tells folktales, and her works include the folktale picture book *Yuki Onna* and collections of folk tales *Onna no Ko no Mukashibanashi* and *Chaachan no Mukashibanashi* (won the Sankei Children's Book Award JR Prize).

AJIADO CO.,LTD.: AJIADO CO.,LTD. is an animation planning and production company founded in 1978. They have worked on numerous animations for TV, including *Manga Nippon Mukashi Banashi*, *Chibi Maruko Chan*, and *Nintama Rantaro*. They have also created animation in a wide range of fields, including commercials and movies such as a film version of *Kaiketsu Zorori*

Keisuke Nishimoto: Keisuke Nishimoto was born in Nara Prefecture in 1934, and is an emeritus professor at Showa Women's University. He is active in a wide range of fields as a critic, folklore researcher, and writer of children's stories, and has authored over 600 books. His main works include *Nishimoto Keisuke Jido Bungakuron Korekushon* (3 volumes) (the Iwaya Sazanami Literature Award Special Prize) and *Moichido Yomitai Kodomo no Tame no Bungaku*; his picture books include *Ojiichan no Gokuraku Gokuraku* and *Mayonaka no Tanjokai*.

He's not at all apologetic about it, and gets on the bus clutching the toy that he wanted. But even though this bus should be the one that he usually takes, today it somehow looks different.

The driver is... a skeleton. The other passengers seem uneasy. Then, the next bus stop is announced. "Hell, Itchome," he hears. It looks like Tetchan has unknowingly taken the bus to Hell.

Each of the passengers had a reason for riding this bus. But while they have all forgotten their own reasons, Enma, the King of Hell, has not. The driver tells them about the many "bad things" that they have done until now. The passengers regret the things that he tells them, but it's too late. Once they get off the bus, they will all turn into ogres.

Rather than saying "you must not do bad things," this book asks its readers why something is a bad thing (to do to someone). Its themes include mutual understanding and the importance of thinking about other people's feelings—how do your actions make the people around you or the people you are talking to feel?

At the end of the story, Tetchan, who has taken something that is important to someone else, is about to have "something" stolen that is important to him. Then, for the first time he finally understands the feelings of the child he took from, and changes completely when he gets off the bus.

As you can see by looking at the time in the clock, this story actually depicts events that last only a few minutes. It incorporates the authors' message that regret, even for doing something wrong without really thinking about it, is a feeling that lasts for a long time in our lives.



Nao Arita: Nao Arita was born in Fukuoka Prefecture in 1979. Her first work as a picture book writer was *Oppai chan* (Poplar Publishing Co., Ltd.), for which she won the 24th Kembuchi Picture Book Village Alpaca Prize. Her other works include *Toireko chan* (responsible for illustrations/Poplar Publishing Co., Ltd.), and *Onara hime* (responsible for text/ Shinnihon Shuppansha).

Masashi Anraku: Masashi Anraku was born in Hiroshima in 1975. Daddy Wildcat is on his way home to his wife and son, thinking with great satisfaction about how much his son admires him, when he spots a tastylooking mouse trying to make himself scarce. Licking his chops, he is about to pounce, when the little creature cries out with great bravado, "I'm not scared of you!" and declares that if the wildcat tries to eat him, "My daddy will teach you a lesson!" As the wildcat scoffs that a mouse's father is still just a mouse, Daddy Mouse appears. The younger mouse's confidence in his father, briefly shaken when he see the stick quavering, is reaffirmed when the wildcat turns tail. Both fathers' great love for their sons

comes through loud and clear despite their sharply contrasting circumstances.

In *Why Does This One Butterfly Make Oof Cry?*, Oof is oblivious when other insects die, but when a butterfly that wanders into his room dies, he breaks down in tears; the story is about the preciousness of life. *Is One Bear Worth a Hundred Mice?* makes readers think about how different kinds of living things can coexist. While young readers are entertained by the interactions between Oof and the other animals, parents are struck by how deep some of Oof's questions go, giving the book an appeal across generations.



Toshiko Kanzawa: Toshiko Kanzawa was born in Fukuoka Prefecture in 1924, and spent her early childhood in Hokkaido and Karafuto (Sakhalin). She graduated from Bunka Gakuin's Faculty of Literature, and actively participated at the forefront of a wide range of literature, including poetry, nursery songs, picture books, nursery tales, full-length works, and children's literature. In addition to the *Oof, the Bear Cub* children's tales and picture books (Poplar Publishing Co., Ltd.), she has created numerous other works that have also been read again and again over the generations, including *Chibikko Kamu no Boken* [The Adventures of Little Kamu] (Rironsha), *Usagi no Moko* [Moko the Rabbit] (Shinnihon Shuppansha), and *Furaipan Jiisan* [*Frying-pan Grandfather*](Akane Shobo). There are anthologies of her nursery tales: *The Toshiko Kanzawa Collection: Five Volumes* (Akane Shobo), and *Kanzawa Toshiko no Ohanashi no Jikan: Zen 5 Kan* [Toshiko Kanzawa Storytime: Five Volumes] (Poplar Publishing Co., Ltd.). She has been awarded many prizes, including the Japan Juvenile Writers Association Prize, the Shogakukan Award for Children's Publishing Culture, the Japanese Children's Songs Award, the Robo-no-Ishi Literary Award, the Iwaya Sazanami Literature Award, and the Mobil Children's Culture Award. She lives in Tokyo Prefecture.

Yosuke Inoue: Yosuke Inoue was born in Akasaka in Tokyo in 1931. He graduated from Musashino Art University's Department of Western Painting. He developed diverse creative activities, including manga, tableaus, set design, and picture books. His own picture books include *Around the Corner* (Fukuinkan Shoten) and *Wacky Rail Rides* (Billiken Shokai), and he worked on numerous children's books in addition to the *Oof, the Bear Cub series* (Poplar Publishing Co., Ltd.). His art books include *Mokuhan: Tokyo Hyaku Kaku Fu* (Kyoto Shoin), *Illustration NOW* (Rippu Shobo), *Inoue Yosuke DoKu Gashu 1931-2016*, and *Inoue Yosuke Ehon Gashu 1931-2016* (both published by Tamagawa University Press). He has won many prizes, including the Bungeishunju Manga Award, the Tokyo Illustrators' Club Award, the Shogakukan Award for Painting, the Japanese Picture Book Award Grand Prize, and the JBBY Award. He passed away in 2016.

Eiko Kadono: Eiko Kadono (1935–) was born in Tokyo. She moved to Brazil for two years when she was 25, and wrote her maiden work, *Ruijinnyo shōnen, Burajiru o tazunete* (Brazil and My Friend Luizinho), a story about a boy who loves to dance the samba, based on her experiences there. Seven years after its release she began writing and publishing children's stories. Among the many accolades she has received are the Robō-no-Ishi Literary Award in 1984 for *Watashi no mama wa Shizuka-san* (My Mama is Shizuka) and *Zubon senchō-san no hanashi* (Tales of an Old Sea Captain). She won the Noma Prize for Children's Literature, the Shogakukan Children's Publication Culture Award, and a place on the IBBY Honor List in 1985 for *Majo no takkyūbin* (tr. *Kiki's Delivery Service*), which was adapted into a wildly popular animated film by renowned director Hayao Miyazaki. She won the Hans Christian Andersen Author Award in 2018.

Kuniko Nagasaki: Kuniko Nagasaki (1970–) is a native of Tokyo. Since graduating from Tama Art University's Department of Textile Design she has worked as a freelance illustrator of magazines, books, and advertising. In addition to illustrating, she has published collections of her pictures, including *Nagasaki Kuniko no shishū no hon* (Kuniko Nagasaki's Embroidery Book) and *Daydream Nation*. She has also illustrated many picture books, among them *Panda no Ponpon* (Ponpon the Panda) and *Shōto torippu* (A Short Trip). She is known for her bold compositions and charming characters. Her style makes ample use of her design skills, and her work in various genres is highly regarded. Kuniko Nagasaki's MARBLE RAMBLE, a collection of manga versions of great literature, was chosen as a Jury Selection work in the Manga Division of the Japan Media Arts Festival.

Synopsis

During the summer vacation, Kaito's grandpa comes to live with his family from a far-away town. But his grandpa calls Kaito "Mamoru," the name of his grandpa's older brother who died when he was seven years old.

Even though Kaito's grandpa has always been kind, he cries like a child, tries not to go in the bath, and causes trouble for his daughter, Kaito's mother, so Kaito is asked to look after him.

One day, after seeing the sparrows taking dust baths in the garden, Kaito and his grandpa bathe together, and have a fun time. Kaito's parents thank him for this. But his grandpa hates getting in the bath more and more, and starts failing to use the toilet. A decision is made: Kaito's grandpa will go to a facility for older people. Ponko is a foal that has escaped from a ranch and is living in a forest. She grows from a young filly to an adult as she spends her days with an old tree, Ekashi, and the strange stink bugs in this beautifully subtle tale.

Ponko is a Dosanko filly who was born on a ranch in Hokkaido. She hated the ranch and ran away, and is now living in the wild. This is Ponko's forest. She goes where she wants to, and walks as she wants to. Freedom is here. Her main conversational partner is the elderly tree, Ekashi. One day, she is walking along a grassy area, when strange "fluffy creatures" appear. Then...

Set in the wilds of Hokkaido, this story beautifully depicts the growth stages of Ponko, a Dosanko horse, from foal to filly, and then to adult. Readers of this generation will surely be touched by the unique way that she faces herself when she is a filly, knowing that she is becoming an adult, and really empathize with her.

This book also tells us about the way the Ainu people live from Ponko's perspective. In the summer 2020, Upopoy (National Ainu Museum and Park) opened in Shiraoi Town, Hokkaido, as a hub for the revival and development of Ainu culture. Now, when people are talking more seriously about the importance of respecting the dignity of Japan's indigenous people and creating a culture that overflows with diversity, we believe that a work in which readers can naturally come into contact with Ainu culture within the story will play an important role in children's reading experience.

This is a tale filled with wishes to pass on to the future, within a story overflowing with the sparkle of subtle sensitivity by Taichi Kato, who lives in Hokkaido and has led children's literature in Japan for many years.

Taichi Kato: Taichi Kato was born into a farming family in Takinoue Town, Mombetsu District, Hokkaido, in 1934. He now lives in Otaru City. After graduating from Hokkaido University, he became an employee of Sapporo City in 1958. He was responsible for the practical work involved in the establishment of Sapporo Art Park; following this, he left his job, aged 52. In 1987, he became a professor of Wakkanai Hokusei Junior College. After five years of employment here, he devoted himself to literary activity. He has worked on many titles set in Hokkaido. His main works include Shiroi Epuron Shiroi Yagi [White Apron White Goat] (Kaisei-sha Ltd.); Fubuki da Hashire [It's a Blizzard, Run] (Iwasaki Shoten); Fubuki no Ie no Nonko [Nonko of Blizzard House], for which he won the first Kita no Jido Bungakusho prize; Sogen: Bokuto Kokkoushi no Daichi (Akane Shobo), which won the 26th Japan Juvenile Writers Association Prize; and Tooku e Iku Kawa [The River that Flows Far Away] (Kumon Publishing Co., Ltd.), which won the 22nd Akai Tori Literary Award.

Yayoi Ohno: Yayoi Ohno was born in Chiba Prefecture. She became familiar with plants from a young age under her grandfather, who loved gardening. After working at a landscaping company, she became active as a freelance illustrator and a landscaper. Her main picture books include *Joro-san* [Mr. Watering Can] (Kaisei-sha Ltd.), Bonsai Ehon [A Bonsai Picture Book] (Asunaro Shobo), Kusaki to Mita Yume: Makino Tomitaro Monogatari [Plants and a Dream: The Story of Tomitaro Makino] (Shuppan Works Inc.), and Minna no Engeiten: Shunkashuto wo Tanoshimu Niwazukuri [A Gardening Shop for Everyone: Creating a Garden to Enjoy in All Four Seasons] (Fukuinkan Shoten).


Taxi in the Stars

Goro Matsui's taxi is sky blue, and he always keeps it clean and shiny. Numerous heartwarming stories about the mild-mannered driver and his sometimes rather unusual passengers have been collected in three volumes under the series title *The Sky Colored Taxi*. The present volume, *White Hat*, contains eight such tales.

The title story is about Matsui and a white butterfly. One day Matsui is driving along when he sees a small white hat on the side of the road. When he stops the car and picks it up, a white butterfly flies out from underneath. Imagining that the little boy to whom the hat must certainly belong will be disappointed at losing the butterfly he had caught, Matsui places a summer citrus from a box of fruit his mother had sent him under the hat. When he gets back into his car, he finds a little girl in the back seat who says she is lost. After learning that she wants to go to Blossom Lane, he begins driving in that direction, but then he realizes the girl has disappeared, and when he looks out the window he sees lots of white butterflies fluttering over a field in front of an apartment house.

In *Block 3 Sycamore Street*, Matsui picks up a woman who appears to be about 40. When he nears the address of the title, on a street he's never been on before, the woman asks him to wait while she goes into a small house. When she returns, she tells him that she had lived in that house until the end of World War II, and it was 22 years ago on this day that she lost her three-year-old twin sons in an air raid. Each time she thinks of them, she feels as if she has gone back in time to the age she was then. Matsui delivers the woman back to the train station, but the passenger who alights from the car is an elderly old lady.

Filled with warmth and evoking much nostalgia, these tales continue to win the hearts of succeeding generations of readers as they are passed down from parent to child.



Reading Notes

Sadami = Emperor Uda was Japan's oldest cat blogger!

Emperor Uda (867–931) was a real historical person. His father, Emperor Koko, had given up his title and become a commoner, but after Koko's death Uda was reinstated as royalty and enthroned. In Emperor Uda's diary, the Kanpyo Gyoki, he writes endless praise for the black cat he was given by his father, excusing himself by saying "because I received it from the late emperor I simply have to take care of it"—the diary is famous as the cat diary of the "tsundere"* emperor. This book is written from the perspective of a black cat brought to Japan from Tang China, and depicts the cat and Emperor Uda. Enjoy the uniqueness of the cat's perspective and a story of characters with human kindness.

*Tsundere: A person who can be aloof and cold but also has a softer side

Senshu Watanabe: Senshu Watanabe was born in Tokyo in 1975, but lived in Beijing when he was in elementary and middle school.
